


How a family of four expanded the bathroom by stealing a few feet from the closets.

classic black-and-white bathroom can be appealing. But the look wasn't working for interior decorator Heather Gilmour Herbert of Toronto's Room by Room. "With two preteens in the house, water consumption and low maintenance are big issues," she says. Here's how Heather designed an efficient space with a fresh look that really works for her family of four. > The tiny 51/2- by 61/2-foot bathroom was expanded by bumping out a wall into the adjoining bedroom's closet and the hall linen closet (see floor plan). A whopping 13 square feet was gained to accommodate all the new fixtures.

> Choosing a deep, space-saving 60-inch acrylic tub allowed just enough room for a custom-built 15-inch-wide floor-to-ceiling storage cabinet, which was stained to match the new vanity. Towels and toiletries can now be conveniently stored in the bathroom.

> A new two-door vanity with a mint green tempered-glass countertop and porcelain vessel sink replaced the pedestal sink, which provided little surface area and no storage.

> Large 12- by 24-inch porcelain tiles, in a rich brown with a hint of metallic, line the shower wall. A glass tile border adds a touch of shimmer and decorative detail.

> The matching 24- by 24-inch tiles on the floor complete the clean and modern look, and make the room appear larger.

> A new energy-efficient window was installed and trimmed with window jambs made from wood shelves salvaged from some old kitchen cupboards.

> A water-efficient toilet was repositioned beside the window and away from the bathroom door.

> Baseboards recycled from a kitchen wall that was removed were installed in the bathroom.

> An adjustable-height shower bar makes sense in a house with growing children, and the hand-held showerhead makes cleanup easy.
